## CMS SAYS HOSPICE SPECIAL PROGRAM FOCUS WILL NOT BE IMPLEMENTED IN 2025

With CMS pledging it would not resume implementation of the hospice Special Focus Program (SFP), a federal court ordered a stay on litigation. The group of state organizations and one hospice provider organization that filed the litigation include the Texas Association for Home Care and Hospice, Indiana Association for Home and Hospice Care, Association for Home and Hospice Care of North Carolina, South Carolina Home Care and Hospice Association, and Houston Hospice

Rachel Harmon, executive director of the Texas Association for Home Care & Hospice, called the action an important step in the work with CMS to create an SFP "'that truly serves patients and fulfills Congress' intent to identify and improve poor performing hospices."
